fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been; love is come again like wheat arising green

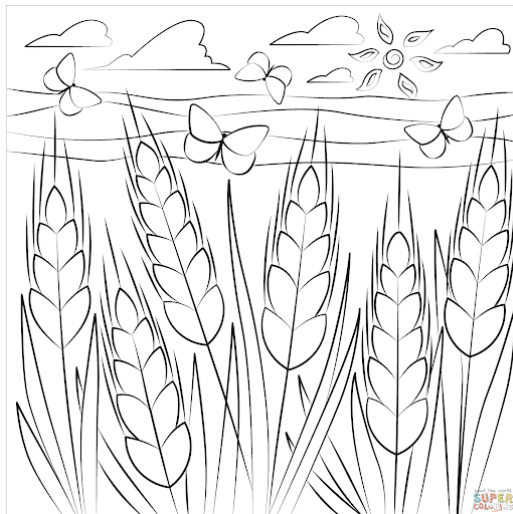
Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
